



# Physical Education and Games at Archbishop Cranmer C of E Primary Academy

**Progress**  
By the end of each key stage, pupils are expected to know, apply and understand the matters, skills and processes specified in the long term plan. Progression of personal excellence is equally important. Each term begins with a baseline assessment of the fundamental skills. Pupils take ownership of these assessments and track their own personal development. Pupils also track their own progress in the ABC Marathon challenge which is completed as part of the daily mile. Registers are kept to log attendance in extra-curricular clubs and representing school in sporting events.

**Values and Drivers**  
Physical Education and Sports at Archbishop Cranmer is about helping pupils to lead full and valuable lives through engaging in purposeful and high-quality activity. We instill the values of values of determination, honesty, passion, respect, self-belief and teamwork. These values drive behaviours, qualities and interpersonal skills in sporting experiences, scenarios and attitudes.

**Culture of Opportunity**  
Extra-curricular activities such as table tennis, netball and handball; School Games Gold Award; School Games Day; Intra-school events as part of the Rushcliffe Partnership; Chance to Shine cricket; Belvoir Cricket; Bikeability Level 1 and 2; Extra-curricular clubs; Representing school as a Sports Leader; The ABC Marathon Challenge; Year 3/4/5/6 swimming; Daily Mile.  
Engaging in national sporting events, such as Sport Relief and Joe Wicks live HIIT training.  
Links with local sporting teams, such as Nottingham Forest.

**Big Ideas**  
We believe that sporting success relies on the development of key fundamental skills: agility, endurance, balance, coordination and upper and lower body strength.  
Engagement in competitive sports and activities is encouraged to all, to develop character and help embed values.

**Curriculum Content and Sequencing**  
We employ specialists who work closely with teachers to deliver high quality physical education to Key Stage 2 pupils. This takes place as part of a sports afternoon which comprises of a rotation of 3 activities.  
In Key Stage 1, all pupils have a minimum of 2 hours of activity per week.  
Each year group will learn PE in accordance with the long-term plan which outlines the progression of skills through each Key Stage.
