## Pupil Safeguarding Questionnaire Results – July 2023

Pupils from classes Foundation through to Year 6 completed a Pupil Safeguarding Questionnaire in July 2023. Results are very positive and helpful moving forward. The results have been shared with staff and Governors and will feed into our School Improvement Plan.

- **100%** of children feel safe at school.
- **100%** of children think that our school teaches them how to stay safe.
- **100%** of children know what to do in the event of a fire in school.
- **100%** of children learn about E-Safety and know how to keep safe when using the internet.
- **100%** of children think that school makes sure only adults checked as 'safe' are allowed in the building.
- **100%** of children said that they feel safe and well looked after when taken on a school visit.
- **100%** of children understand what bullying means and know what to do and who to talk to if they feel they, or someone else, is being bullied.
- **100%** of children feel that school encourages them to respect others and treat everyone equally.
- **98%** of children are happy at school.
- **99%** of children feel looked after by school when they are ill or injured.
- **99%** of children feel that the school site is kept safe and clean.
- **100%** of children feel that they are encouraged to do the best they can and are shown how to improve work.
- **100%** of children think they are encouraged to be determined and do Take Care work at all times, even when learning is difficult.
- **100%** of children know they can ask for help if needed.
- **99%** of children feel that they can go to an adult in school if they feel worried.
- **99%** of children would recommend our school to other children.

Follow up action:

<p>73% of children think that children are <b>always</b> friendly and act with integrity at our school.</p>	<p>All staff should remind and encourage pupils of our school values and Take Care Learning Behaviours. Values assembly scheduled for new term. Teachers to use HeartSmart and SEAL opportunities to remind children of the features of good friendships and how acting with integrity helps to keep ourselves healthy.</p>
<p>63% of pupils said that they were <b>always</b> happy at school.</p>	<p>Staff to encourage and remind pupils of positive reasons for being in school and ensure that achievements are celebrated using school reward systems and home-school communication methods. HeartSmart and mindfulness techniques should be used to encourage positivity and recognition of their achievements.</p>

<p>68% of children <b>always</b> think their lessons are interesting and fun, and 29% think this <b>most of the time</b>, with 2% thinking this <b>some of the time</b>.</p>	<p>Teachers to consider pupil voice in lesson planning – how can children be encouraged to take ownership of their learning?  Subject leaders to invest more in their subjects – consider what they want their subject to achieve in an interesting and fun way. Develop links with Pupil Parliament curriculum leads.  Use of hooks to engage learners.  New curriculum resources being used for 23/24 school year – use data to evaluate impact following next survey.</p>
<p>93% of pupils said they have <b>never</b> been bullied this school year. 5% said that they had been bullied <b>some of the time</b>, 1% said <b>most of the time</b> and 1% said <b>all of the time</b>.</p>	<p>Despite 100% of children ‘understanding what bullying means’ and ‘knowing who to talk to if they feel they are being bullied or think someone else is being bullied’, ensure that the definition is clear to children.  Anti-Bullying Award programme re-starts in September 2024 – ensure regular assemblies to highlight ways in which children can access help and support.  Class teachers spoken with pupils who gave some/most/ all answers to investigate.  All staff to ensure cases of child-on-child abuse and friendship issues are reported to teachers/ DSLs.</p>
<p>73% of pupils <b>always</b> feel safe on the playground.</p>	<p>Sports Leaders and Playground Pals to ensure friendly and safe games are encouraged during playtimes.  Children to be encouraged to bring outdoor shoes to complete daily mile on field during playtimes.</p>

Pupils’ responses within the ‘some of the time’ and ‘never’ categories answers were discussed with their class teachers to ascertain reasons for the given answers and investigated as appropriate.
