Child-Friendly Safeguarding and Child Protection Standard

Feeling safe and happy at Archbishop Cranmer C of E Primary Academy

At Archbishop Cranmer, we pledge to take care of ourselves, each other, the world and with our work. As part of this we want to make sure that you feel looked after, safe and happy when you are in and out of school. Sometimes we don't know if something bad is happening, so you need to tell us so that we can help.

This document explains how everyone at Archbishop Cranmer help to take care of one another through something called 'Safeguarding and Child Protection'.

Child protection ensures that:

- Your health, welfare and safety are the most important things in school;
- Our pupils are respected and kept safe;
- You can make good progress in your school work and feel happy;
- We teach you how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect yourselves and stay safe.

How we help to keep you safe at Archbishop Cranmer:

- We provide a safe environment for you to learn in.
- Our gates are locked during school hours and only approved visitors are allowed to come into school. You will know that a visitor has been approved if they are wearing a blue visitor's badge/ lanyard.
- All teachers and school staff have special training on how to keep you safe. Everyone who works at our school wears a red staff lanyard and has an ID badge with their picture on.
- We teach you how to be safe and how to recognise risks through our HeartSmart lessons, Computing and e-Safety lessons, assemblies and much more.
- We think that it's important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.



If you need to talk – we promise to listen:

- You can talk to any adult in school – including your teacher, Mrs Stevens, Mrs Rogers and Mrs Hodgson.
- Miss Wilkinson, Mrs Chilton and Mrs Hodgson have had special training to help you if you are worried about your mental health and wellbeing.
- It is Mrs Stevens' special job to keep you safe – talk to her if you are worried.
- Put something in the Worry Monster in the Sunshine Room, or write a note for your class teacher.
- Tell a friend and go with your friend to tell an adult.

Remember, don't keep a secret if someone is:

- Bullying you;
- Saying funny things to you that you do not like or which upsets you;
- Touching you;
- Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol;
- Hitting you or hurting you;
- Taking your things;
- Sending unkind messages on the internet or on your mobile device.



Remember: You can talk to us about **anything** that is worrying you, whether it's happening in school or away from school and whether it's about you or someone else.
