Pupil Voice Questionnaire – Summer Term 2026 Results



Headlines:

- 100% of children feel safe at school.
- 100% of children feel safe at playtime and lunchtime.
- 100% of children know how to stay safe online.
- 100% of children believe an adult will help them with a problem.
- 100% of children feel included and valued at school.

Potential Lines of Enquiry:

- All KS2 pupils gave a positive response about children treating one another kindly and respectfully: 55% selected always, 43% most of the time and 2% sometimes.
⇒ Continue to reinforce consistent expectations for kindness and respect across the school, particularly during less-structured times.
- 96% of KS2 pupils feel they can always or most of the time be themselves at school; four pupils selected sometimes and one selected rarely.
⇒ Continue to promote an inclusive culture in which pupils' individuality is recognised and valued, using class-based pupil voice to explore what helps all children feel fully comfortable being themselves.
- Free-text responses were overwhelmingly positive. A small number of pupils suggested further reassurance around everyday safety routines, including visitors, gates, supervision and planned alarms or drills.
⇒ Continue to review pupils' suggestions alongside existing routines and provide regular, clear and age-appropriate reassurance about how the school keeps everyone safe.

Additional KS2 Safeguarding Findings

Measure	Result
Knows where to go if worried	97% named at least one trusted person; 3% selected only "I am not sure".
Understands the full definition of bullying	80% selected all three repeated behaviours without identifying a one-off incident as bullying.
Reported being bullied this year	7% Yes (8 pupils), 4% Not sure (5 pupils), 88% No (99 pupils).
Told an adult, among the 13 Yes/Not sure responses	85% Yes (11 pupils); 15% No (2 pupils).
Did adults help, among the 13 follow-up responses	69% Yes, 23% Mostly and 8% A little: all reported receiving at least some help.
